Three of Toledo's finest bowlers were inducted into the Gr. Toledo USBC Association Hall of Fame on Sunday, November 14th in an induction ceremony which was held at the Rossford Eagles. Following a lively cocktail reception, Hall of Fame Chairman Sallye Condon introduced the three to those present.
Don Genalo joined the Professional Bowling Tour in June of 1981. He had already established himself as an outstanding bowler. In his third PBA stop, he cashed at Windsor, Canada. He went on to a career that now includes over 35 USBC certified 300 games. He is one of the few bowlers to roll two perfect games in USBC competition. Don is the proud owner of six PBA titles and ten PBA Regional titles as well as multiple Gr. Toledo titles. He was a member of the KJ Excavating team that was Co-Champions in 2001 at national tournament. And Don continues to compete on the local level with his latest victory coming in the 2010 Gr. Toledo Senior Masters Tournament. Don Genalo truly exemplifies Superior Performance and we proudly add his name to the record books.
Joseph Cooke, Sr. widely known as Joe Cooke, has been bowling since 1969 and has always been a sanctioned/certified member. Joe served as a director, vice president and then president of the Gr. Toledo Bowling Association. In 1988 he and the late Charles Gibson, Jr., a TBA Hall of Famer, formed the Young Senior Bowling League, a unique league of men 55+. One of the first of its kind in the country. The league started with 55 men and now has over 90. Joe has served as the only secretary of the league. Joe won TNBA Men's Doubles in Buffalo, N.Y. with Andre Tiggs as well as the city Father and Son Championship with son, Kevin. He also won the senior pro-am tournament in 1993-1994 along with several league championships. Joe is currently bowling in four leagues carrying a $200+$ average. His highest average was a 207 ; highest series a 765 and has a 300 game to his credit. Joe's dedicated service to the Toledo bowlers has earned him the honor of being chosen in the Meritorious Service category.

## Woessner Inducted Into Bowling Council Hall of Fame

The Twenty-Third Annual Ohio Bowling Hall of Fame induction ceremony was held Saturday, November 5, 2010 at the Embassy Suites in Columbus, Ohio. Jodi Woessner was inducted in the Superior Performance category for her outstanding record of bowling performances. Her bio read; "Jodi has won so many titles in her bowling career that we would need two pages to list them all." Some of those mentioned were her 27300 games and 19800 series, the highest being an 856 . Her performance in the 2010 USBC Women's Championship made history when she set
a new all events record of 2,330 and tied for the highest individual series in the 91 years of the women's championships with an 816 series. Her Ohio USBC Women's Championship titles number eight along with winning the Buckeye Belle Tournament in 2006. Jodi has also won the Michigan Queen's Tournament in 1996, was the World Team Challenge Regional Champion in 1995 and 1996, the Hoinke Classic Women's Singles champion and Doubles scratch champion in 2007. Jodi was also a member of the WIBC National Team Championship team in 1995.

Jodi has well earned the title of superior performer as she joins the ranks of the other 163 inductees into the Ohio Bowling Hall of Fame.


## Cole Honored with League Award

The Ohio USBC Women's Bowling Association each year honors league bowlers in various average categories for excellence in their weekly sessions.

Tim Black has distinguished himself as one of Toledo's top performers over the period of 35+ years. He has consistently carried a 198 or better average since the 1971-72 season and has nine 300 games to his credit. His highest series came at the PBA Miller High Life Open in Saginaw, Michigan in 1983 with an 815. He has to his credit many TBA bowling championships starting in 1983, as his team, Bartz Viviano captured the Actual Team title. 1984 saw him paired with Rick Egger to secure the Actual Doubles title. In 1986 he won the TBA Masters Singles. In other competitions he was named champion in the 1984 Varsity Lanes Annual Scratch Sweeper, Bowling Green, Oh. That 815 high series was rolled in the 1983 PBA Miller High Life Open in Saginaw where he averaged 244 for the tournament with two 300 games. Tim certainly has been a shining example of professionalism and we welcome him to the rolls of the GTUSBCA Hall of Fame as a Star of Yesteryear.
